He currently serves as Artistic Director of MitchellMovement, his own project, while fusing his unique voice of contemporary dance with aspects of physical theatre/clowning techniques. MitchellMovement has presented work for the Harvest Contemporary Dance Festival (2018, 2019, 2022, 2023), College of Du Page's Choreography Competition (2016, 2017), Inaside Dance Chicago's Choreography Showcase (2018, 2019), collaborations with Symbiosis Arts (2020, 2023), entertainment for Chicago House's annual fundraiser (2023), Trifecta Dance Festival (2024), and has co-presented work Internationally at the Kieler-Woche Festival (Kiel, Germany, 2017). Taylor has also served as an Artist in Residence with Washington and Lee University (2018), Southeast Missouri State University (2018, 2021), The University of Louisiana Lafayette (2019), and Keshet Center for the Arts (2018). Currently, Taylor enjoys integrating Feldenkrais® ATM® as an exciting new part of his offerings in creation and education.
